Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Johnson City Village Board held on Tuesday, January 3, 2017 in the Municipal Building, 243 Main St., Johnson City

Mayor Deemie called the meeting to order at 7:30pm, led the Pledge of Allegiance and noted the fire exits.

APPROVAL OF BOARD MINUTES

A motion to approve the minutes of the December 20, 2016 regular meeting and work session was made by Trustee Balles and seconded by Trustee Walker. The motion carried with all those present voting in the affirmative.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

- [1] Rezone 117 Oakdale Road (TM #143.45-1-2) located in the Village from Neighborhood Commercial (NC) to Industrial (IN) pursuant to Section 300 Article 52 of the Village Code.

Mayor Deemie opened the public hearing.

Julie Deemie, Zoa Avenue - Asked about the storage units that will be located on the site – what color will they be? What material will they be made of? Are they water tight? What will they be used for? Will they be anchored to a concrete pad?



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Mr. Terry Deamer, applicant – Explained that they are new steel containers, like ocean going shipping containers. They will be tan in color and are water tight. There are for residential storage. They are very heavy so they just sit on the ground. Mayor Deemie asked if they are going to be stacked. Mr. Deamer stated no. Trustee King asked how many containers there will be as it is a large wooded property. Mr. Deamer explained that they will be clearing the property for maximum visibility from the highway. The number of containers is not determined yet. It will depend on how well the business does. They will bring units in as they are rented.

Trustee Walker explained that the purpose of this hearing is for the rezoning of the property. The issues of how many containers, how they are stacked, etc. are Planning Board issues. What he does with the property after the rezone will go in front of the Planning Board. Mayor Deemie explained that yes, but this is good information to have. Mr. Deamer stated that he is happy to share information but the engineers are still working on the plans so he may not have all of the answers yet.

Mayor Deemie explained that if Mr. Deamer does not get the rezone, then there will not be project.

Trustee Meaney asked if there were going to be any restrictions on what can be stored in the containers. Mr. Deamer stated yes. They will be welcoming the NYS Police, Broome County Sheriff and the JC Police to use the property to train their dogs. They will post that no illegal substances allowed. Also no flammable chemicals, no food products, no vehicle storage within the containers.

Mayor Deemie asked if the property will be video monitored. Mr. Deamer explained that it will be gated with access codes. Access will only be allowed from sunrise to sunset.

Trustee Walker asked about the use of the building on the property. Mr. Deamer explained that there will be a rental office for the storage units and a classic car showroom. Trustee Walker asked if there will be maintenance on the cars done there. Mr. Deamer stated no. They will do vehicle inspections done there.

Trustee Balles asked for clarification of where the classic vehicles will be. Mr. Deamer stated that the rental office will be where the tellers were when the building was a credit union. The rest of the building, approximately 5,700sq. ft., will be the vehicle showroom. Trustee Balles commented on the flood zone. Mr. Deamer stated that the building did flood in 2011 but did not flood in 2006.

Carol Laskoski, Edward Street – Asked what the difference is between the existing commercial zoning and the proposed industrial zoning. Attorney Jacobs reviewed the list of uses that are allowed in an industrial zoning district and the types of uses allowed in a commercial zoning district.

Mayor Deemie closed the public hearing.

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PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR – VISITORS

Mayor Deemie opened the second privilege of the floor.

David Kellam, Berkley Street – Stated that the lights on the Service Road are out again as well as the lights on the Lester Avenue underpass. He asked if this can be looked at as it is a safety hazard.

Corinna Johnson, Cook Street – Encouraged people to get involved in the Village and different groups. The JC Partners are looking for a new sponsor for the Cruze-Inz and a chairperson to do Carousel Day this year. If they don't find a chair ASAP the event will not be held this year. There is an event called Friendly Families which is the Johnson City School District, the JC Neighborhood Project and the Bridge Community Center working together to educate and inform families of services and programs available to them. They meet at The Bridge at 5:30pm on the first Thursday of the month. Ms. Johnson also explained that her friend's daughter is missing and provided details.

Carol Laskoski, Edward Street – Asked how long the one-way street will be in effect at the JSTP. Mayor Deemie stated that they are not sure. It is a multi-year project. Trustee King stated at least 2 years. Ms. Laskoski also spoke about lighting issues, specifically at the 201 intersection. Mayor Deemie stated that the Board discussed this during their work session and explained that it is in the hands of the state and the Town of Union. After they are repaired the state is hoping to enter into an agreement with the Town of Union to take the lights back over. Trustee Walker explained that the Board asked the Mayor to write a letter to the state and the town to expedite it and he stated that he is concerned with how dark it is at the Reynolds Road and Harry L. Drive intersection. Ms. Laskoski commented on the new LED lights on the 201 ramp. Trustee Walker stated that the Town has started a program where they are replacing the street lights with LED lights.

Rick Wallikas, Deyo Hill Road – Stated that last year he reported a recurring problem with the sewage line on Deyo Hill Road. It is not going to be corrected by pumping. He stated that it is caused by the nursing home put garbage in. He put in a back flow preventer and has done everything on his end and they are still having blockages in the sewer line. He talked to Bob Bennett and told him that when the main line backs up it backs up into the laterals and that is what floods the properties. He has filed FOIL requests and read the reports. There are numerous reports of grease in the line. Something has to be done. It has actually been longer than 1 year - his father in law had issues up there 15 years with the property flooding several times and nothing was done with the sewer line. Mayor Deemie explained that it was discussed during the work session and Bob Bennett discussed the situation. They lines appear to be clear. They are working on getting the FOIL completed. They are looking to see what they can do to address the situation. Mr. Wallikas stated that he thinks Mr. Bennett is wrong. He has spoken to people in the field and they agree with him that it will back into the laterals. He has never seen Bob Bennett up there. He has never come to talk to him. They guys come up there periodically. He marked the manhole covers to see if they were moved. Some were, some weren't. Mayor Deemie explained how some of the covers are notched and go back into the exact same place every time. Mr. Wallikas stated that the reports he received are sloppy. There is no way to justify saying it is done or not. Trustee King asked for clarification on the guys pumping the line out. Mr. Wallikas stated that last summer he saw they guys up there one time pumping the line out. It had grease in it. Trustee King stated that he will talk to Bob.



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Julie Deemie, Zoa Avenue – Thanked Corinna Johnson for always advocating for the less fortunate and all she does for the community. Congratulated Trustee Balles for becoming Deputy Mayor. Asked Trustee Meaney to clarify the pronunciation of his last name. Asked Trustee Meaney why he voted to abstain on the Mayor's appointments. Trustee Meaney explained that there are many names on the list and he does not know the qualifications of all of them so how can he vote yes or no so that is why he abstained.

David Kellam, Berkley Street – Stated that they are starting to work on the Sunrise and Century buildings. That whole area is starting to progress. Next is the BU Nursing School. Mayor Deemie stated that BU has received the funding and is starting some work there.

Carol Laskoski, Edward Street – Stated she is glad we have adopted Roberts Rules of Order.

Mayor Deemie closed the second privilege of the floor.

DECLARATION OF CONFLICTS OF INTERESTS

Mayor Deemie asked the Trustees to declare any Conflicts of Interests at this time as part of the organizational meeting.

Trustee Meaney stated that he is a retired fire fighter and part time bartender and his son is a fire fighter for the Village.

Trustee King stated that he has no conflicts of interest.

Trustee Balles stated that he has no conflicts of interest. He is a retired employee of Lockheed Martin.

Trustee Walker stated that he has no conflicts of interest. He is registered nurse employed at Lourdes Hospital.

Mayor Deemie stated that he works a part time job as an Electrical Draftsman/Technician for O'Brien & Gere Engineers who have worked for the Village in the past, however they do not currently have any business with the Village. If necessary, he would abstain from anything in regards to that company and the Village.
