Resolution #2017 - 31

Accept FEMA settlement relating to 4031-PW2150 of \$1,011,014.24 and increase the 2016 Budget appropriations to allow payment of \$980,479.74 to the Owners.

The Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Board received a FEMA check for PW 2150 in the amount of \$1,011,014.24. The Board requests legislation by the Owners to increase 2016 Budget lines. On the revenue side: J.43960 (State Aid – Emergency) be increased by \$252,753.56 and J.44960 (Federal Aid – Emergency) be increased by \$758,260.68, and that JF.45031 (Flood Fund - Interfund Transfer) be credited/increased by \$30,534.50. On the expense apportionments that J8130.54899 (Reimburse Owners for Rec) be increased by \$980,479.74 that J9950.59000 (Transfer to Capital) be increased by \$30,534.50, and JF8130.559105 (Flood Capital Fund – Professional Services) be increased by \$30,534.50. Payments made via claim to the City of Binghamton (54.8%) in the amount of \$537,302.90 and the Village of Johnson City (45.2%) of \$443,176.84 will then be processed.

Introduce Local Law #2-2017, amending sections of Chapter 264 of the Village Code entitled "Vehicles and Traffic" as follows: §264-87A. (Schedule XII: Parking Prohibited at All Times) to add Overbrook Road, north side, entire length; §264-100 (Schedule XXV: Red-Line Streets) to delete Franklin Street and North Broad Street, and to add Arthur Avenue*, Bernice Street, High Street, Miller Street, and North Broad Street*; §264-101 (Schedule XXVI: Parking Prohibited Between November 1 and April 1) to delete November 1 and replace it with December 1, in the title and the section, and to delete April 1 and replace it with March 31, in the title and the section; to schedule a public hearing on said local law on March 7, 2017 at 7:35 p.m. and to authorize publication of notice of said public hearing.

Resolution #2017 - 40

Authorize the transfer of \$115,000.00 from Contingency (line J8130.55000) and increase Office Lease (line J8130.54511) to allow for the leasing of office space in order to allow the administrative building to be vacated for demolition to make way for the solids handling construction.

The Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Board resolved to transfer \$115,000 from Contingency to Office Lease because of unbudgeted expenses that will be incurred due to the current admin building needing to be vacated so that construction for solids handing structures can be placed on the site. The new administration building is in early construction but will not be ready.

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VILLAGE OF JOHNSON CITY - LOCAL LAW NO. 2 FOR THE YEAR 2017

A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 264 OF THE VILLAGE CODE ENTITLED VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

Section 1. Chapter 264 of the Village Code shall hereby be amended as follows:

§ 264-87 Schedule XII: Parking Prohibited at All Times.

A. No parking anytime. In accordance with the provisions of § 264-21, no person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the following described streets or parts thereof:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Overbrook Road	North	Entire length

B. Remains the same.

[The remainder of this section remains the same]

§ 264-100 Schedule XXV: Red-Line Streets.

In accordance with the provisions of § 264-33B, the following streets or parts of streets* shall be considered red-line streets. "Red-line streets" are those which are designated by signs as only allowing one-side parking. Alternate-street parking regulations shall not supersede posted parking regulations:

Name of Street *Part of street is red line.

Delete the following:

Franklin Street North Broad Street

Insert the following:

Arthur Avenue* Bernice Street High Street Miller Street North Broad Street*

§ 264-101 Schedule XXVI: Parking Prohibited Between November 1 and April 1.

In accordance with the provisions of § 264-32, parking shall be prohibited between November 1 and April 1 on the following described streets or parts of streets:

This <u>Title</u> shall be amended as follows:

Delete: November 1; Replace with: December 1

Delete: April 1; Replace with: March 31

This <u>Section</u> shall be amended as follows:

Delete: November 1; Replace with: December 1

Delete: April 1; Replace with: March 31

[The remainder of this section remains the same]

Section 2. Remainder

Except as hereinabove amended, the remainder of the Code of the Village of Johnson City shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. Separability

The provisions of this Local Law are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words, or parts of this local law or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this local law would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and as if such person or circumstance, to which the local law or part thereof is held inapplicable, had been specifically exempt therefrom.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
