Adopt a resolution requesting Senator Akshar and Assemblyperson Lupardo to sponsor home rule legislation to empower and authorize the Village of Johnson City to pass a local law creating a tax or fee on certain tax exempt properties within the Village.

WHEREAS, the tax base of the Village of Johnson City is shrinking; and

WHEREAS, 3.14% of properties in the Village are currently tax exempt, representing 40.76% of the total assessed value of the Village; and

WHEREAS, taxable property is still being removed from the tax rolls; and

WHEREAS, the New York State mandated property tax cap hinders the Village's ability to generate revenue to provide essential services; and

WHEREAS, that Home Rule Legislation enables the Village of Johnson City to seek and impose a tax or fee for service on certain tax exempt properties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Trustee of the Village of Johnson City duly convened in regular session hereby request that Senator Akshar and Assemblyperson Lupardo sponsor home rule legislation to empower and authorize the Village of Johnson City to pass a local law creating a tax or fee on certain tax exempt properties within the Village and

BE IT RESOLVED that the fee for service includes all current and future tax exempt properties within the Village of Johnson City, with the exception of Houses of Worship and Schools that instruct children in grades twelve and under; and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Board finds and determines that it does not have the legal authority to adopt a local law relating to the proposed legislation or enact the legislation it is requesting; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk-Treasurer shall send certified copies of this Resolution to Senator Akshar and Assemblyperson Lupardo; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized to execute paperwork related to this home rule request; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be effective immediately.

Resolution #2017 – 186

Adopt a resolution requesting Senator Akshar and Assemblyperson Lupardo to sponsor home rule legislation to empower and authorize the Village of Johnson City to pass a local law creating a Hotel/Motel occupancy tax on hotel/motel properties within the Village.



WHEREAS, economic times are difficult; and municipalities need additional non-property tax sources of revenue to fund basic services to keep their communities safe and properly serviced.

WHEREAS, the New York State mandated property tax cap hinders the Village's ability to generate revenue to provide essential services; this legislation will assist the Village of Johnson City to fund necessary services.

WHEREAS, that Home Rule Legislation enables the Village of Johnson City to seek and impose a an occupancy tax on hotel/motel properties within the Village

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Trustee of the Village of Johnson City duly convened in regular session hereby request that Senator Akshar and Assemblyperson Lupardo sponsor home rule legislation to empower and authorize the Village of Johnson City to pass a local law creating a occupancy tax on hotel/motel properties within the Village and

BE IT RESOLVED WHEREAS, the Village desires that the home rule legislation include a requirement that the municipality levying the tax set aside one-sixth of the taxes collected to promote economic development and tourism within the respective municipality; and

BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Board finds and determines that it does not have the legal authority to adopt a local law relating to the proposed legislation or enact the legislation it is requesting; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Clerk-Treasurer shall send certified copies of this Resolution to Senator Akshar and Assemblyperson Lupardo; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor is authorized to execute paperwork related to this home rule request; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be effective immediately.

FIRE (Trustees Balles & Walker)

Resolution #2017 – 187

Adopt the following resolution contracting for the purchase of an aerial truck without competitive bids from a sole source supplier.

WHEREAS, the Village of Johnson City desires to contract for the purchase of an aerial truck without competitive bids from a sole source supplier because of unique circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Johnson City and its Fire Chief have investigated various options with its current aging aerial truck; but have determined that the Village current aerial truck must be replaced; and

WHEREAS, through the investigation, it has become clear that the Village has a valid public interest in a light weight truck with the specific requirements of ample turning radius, an aerial apparatus with a 100 foot aluminum mid mounted aerial platform, a stainless steel body, a single pair of outriggers and a huck bolted aluminum box boom aerial; and



WHEREAS, the Trustees have discussed the justification for this specific requirements as they specifically relate to the Village and the Fire Chief has provide sufficient factual and technical support via a memorandum; and

WHEREAS, the Trustees, upon the recommendation of the Fire Chief, find that the truck is uniquely required for the Village and that the specific requirements are uniquely required in the public interest for the Village;

WHEREAS, this specific truck, with these specific requirements, is only available from Sutphen Fire Apparatus; they are the sole source; and

WHEREAS, therefore there is no substantial equivalent and thus there is no competition for it; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Trustees of the Village of Johnson City duly convened in regular session hereby authorize the purchase of this aerial truck and authorize the Mayor to enter into agreement with Sutphen Fire Apparatus for the purchase of a Sutphen SPH 100 Stock Aerial truck 387 for a total amount of \$997,500, delivery and warranties included; all without advertising for sealed bids as authorized by State Comptroller Opinion 67-558 in situations where items can be purchased from only one source; and

BE IT RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be effective immediately.

Authorize the acceptance of a FEMA settlement relating to 4031-PW2504v1 in the amount of \$2,501,820.69 and further authorize the Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Board Fiscal Officer to modify the 2017 Budget appropriations as follows (J.44960 (Federal Aid – Emergency) be increased by \$2,501,820.69, JF.45031 (Flood Fund - Interfund Transfer) be credited/increased by \$45,589.51, J8130.54899 (Reimburse Owners for Rec) be increased by \$2,456,231.18, J9950.59000 (Transfer to Capital) be increased by \$45,589.51 and JF8130.559105 (Flood Capital Fund – Professional Services) be increased by \$45,589.51 to allow payment of \$2,456,231.18 to the Owners (City of Binghamton (54.8%) in the amount of \$1,346,014.69 and the Village of Johnson City (45.2%) of \$1,110,216.49).
