#### **Resolution #2020 – 65**

Motion to authorize the Mayor to execute and take actions necessary to effectuate the Intermunicipal agreement to continue the Broome –Tioga Stormwater Coalition for Federal Phase II MS4 Stormwater Regulation Implementation In Broome and Tioga Counties.

### **Resolution #2020 - 66**

Motion to authorize the Mayor to execute and take actions necessary to effectuate the Memorandum of Agreement with the Municipal Corporations comprising the Broome –Tioga Stormwater Coalition for Stormwater asset mapping Implementation in Broome and Tioga Counties.

Contingent upon a similar motion being adopted by the City of Binghamton, Motion to accept the Professional Services proposal from GHD Consulting Service Inc., for sampling as required by the CSO-Long Term Control Plan (LTCP) Post-Construction Compliance Monitoring Program; which is a requirement of the Joint Sewer Treatment Plant Owners' CSO permits; and to authorize the Mayor to execute and take actions necessary to effectuate the proposal; in an amount not to exceed the proposal amount.

#### **Resolution #2020 – 69**

WHEREAS, the Village Board adopted Local Law #18-2018, entitled Sewers and Sewage Disposal Local Law, which permits the Village Board to increase or decrease fees by action of the Board; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 222-2 of said Local Law, the Board hereby increases the Annual Sewer Rents as follows:

### ANNUAL SEWER RENTS

First 1,000 cubic feet or less, minimum \$60

Over 1,000 cubic feet, \$7.25 per 100 cubic feet of water supplied.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Board of the Village of Johnson City hereby increases the fees as set forth herein, and these billing rates shall become effective with the next regular billing cycle; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

#### **Resolution #2020 – 70**

**WHEREAS**, by Memorandum, dated March 13, 2020, by the Town of Union Building Official Daria Golazeski, the Village of Johnson City, Village Board of Trustees has been requested to consider declaring unsafe and dangerous the structure at 29-31 Carhart Avenue, Johnson City, New York, which consideration requires a public hearing; and

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

**RESOLVED,** that the Village Board will hold a Public Hearing on April 21, 2020 at 7:35 p.m. to solicit public input on the issue concerning whether the structure at 29-31 Carhart Avenue, Johnson City, New York should be declared unsafe and dangerous; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that notice of this Public Hearing shall be served by mail on the record owner of 29-31 Carhart Avenue, Johnson City, New York and its legal counsel, if known; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that the Town Clerk and Counsel are authorized to take such additional and further action as is necessary to notice the Public Hearing as noted herein; and be it further

**RESOLVED** that in accordance with Section 118-9 of the Village Code, that a clear and imminent danger to life, safety and health exists for persons and property; and as such the building at 29-31 Carhart Avenue, Johnson City, New York must be secured immediately, the Board hereby authorized the Building Inspector to immediately cause the securing of this building.

**Resolution #2020 – 75** 

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON TO INCREASE THE CONTRACTUAL TOTAL AMOUNT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES BY GHD CONSULTING SERVICES INC. BY \$45,000.00 IN ORDER TO CORRECT PRIOR LEGISLATION.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution #2014-165 the Board of Trustees of the Village of Johnson City approved that the City of Binghamton act as Lead Agency to execute a contract with GHD Consulting Services Inc. ("GHD") for professional services for the restoration and rehabilitation of the Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Treatment Plant ("BJCJSTP"); and

**WHEREAS,** the Council of the City of Binghamton adopted Permanent Resolution 14-058 dated September 17, 2014, entitled "A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into a professional services agreement with GHD for the design services for the restoration and rehabilitation of the Binghamton-Johnson City Joint Sewage Treatment Plant"; and

**WHEREAS,** the City legislation states that the agreement with GHD for design services related to the restoration and rehabilitation of the BJCJSTP is not to exceed \$1,266,000; and

**WHEREAS,** GHD's proposal for the contract stated the estimated cost for Work Order-01 thereunder was not to exceed \$595,000; and

**WHEREAS,** GHD's detail supporting the legislation stated the estimated cost for Work Order-01 was not to exceed \$640,000; and

**WHEREAS,** on September 26, 2014 the Mayor of the City of Binghamton executed Work Order-01 with GHD in the contractual amount of \$640,000; and

**WHEREAS,** the difference of \$45,000 must be added to the legislatively-approved total contract amount, increasing it from \$1,266,000 as originally approved to \$1,311,000; and

**WHEREAS,** on March 4, 2020 the Council of the City of Binghamton adopted Permanent Resolution 20-020 entitled "A Resolution to Amend Permanent Resolution 14-058 to Increase the Total Amount for GHD"; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Trustees of the Village of Johnson City wish to ratify the change in contract amount as approved by the Council of the City of Binghamton,

**NOW, THEREFORE,** the Board of Trustees of the Village of Johnson City, duly convened in regular session, does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The Village of Johnson City approves and ratifies the \$45,000 increase in the contract with GHD Consulting Services Inc. approved by the Council of the City of Binghamton and adopted as Permanent Resolution 20-020.

Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon approval by a majority of the Board of Trustees of the Village.
